For the first time, the name title of An'chi shall be raised among you - different from the understanding given by the Masoretes all of those decades ago, and more illustrative than the English interpreters have cared to admit. There is something here - buried within the ancient Ivriyt text - that will tell us more than what we have commonly believed to be the case when it comes to the testimonies in scripture.

We are called to the testimony of Ha'Mashiach twice in the Cepher Chazon (Book of Revelation) for it is those who carry the testimony of Yahusha and who are guarding the commandments of Yahuah who are the target for Ha'Satan in his war against mankind. What do we actually know of the testimonies? What are they exactly?

Let's explore these ideas with openness and see what we can discover, shall we?



The Testimonies of Ar

Blessed are the undefiled in the Way, who walk in the Torah of Yahuah. 2 Blessed are they that guard his testimonies, and that seek him with the whole heart. 3 They also do no iniquity: they walk in his ways.

An'chi (אָנֹכִי) H595 [Masoretic (אָנֹכִי) ânôkîy

A primitive personal pronoun meaning I, or I am.

As a construct it joins the primitive root *ănîy* (אֲנִי) H589 (meaning I am) with kîy (בִי) H3587 (meaning brand or pricked scar).





After these things the Word of Yahuah came unto El⁻Avram in a vision, saying: Fear not, Avram: I am (אָנכִּי) your shield, and your exceeding great reward. 2 And Avram said, Adonai Yahuah, what will you give me, seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house is this Eliy`ezer of Damascus? 3 And Avram said: Behold, to me you have given no seed: and, lo, one born in my house is my heir. 4 And, behold, the Word of Yahuah came unto him, saying: This shall not be your heir; but he that shall come forth out of your own generation shall be your heir. 5 And he brought him forth abroad, and said: Look now toward the heavens, and count the stars, if you be able to number them: and he said unto him: So shall your seed be. 6 And he believed in Yahuah; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

The testimony of Yahuah is a testimony that repeats the miracles of Mitsrayim – the deliverance of the whole of the house of Yashar'el from the land of bondage by an outstretched hand.

But does this end the testimony of Yahuah expressing himself as An'chi? The answer is . . . Not yet.



10 For thus says Yahuah: That after seventy years be accomplished at Babel I will visit you, and perform my good word toward you, in causing you to return to this place. 11 For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says Yahuah, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end. 12 Then shall ye call upon me, and ye shall go and pray unto me, and I will hearken unto you. 13 And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.
