





How do we know how it is said?

First, we cannot be advised by the Yahudiym (Jews):

How do we know how it is said?

Let's take a look at what they really know:

Jews claim to be of the house of Judah. This word in Ivriyt (Hebrew) is H3063

יָהוּדָה

Compare with Yahuah:

יהוה

This is pronounced by the Masorites as Y'hudah (not Yehovadah).
The contracted form is the word for Judea: Yahud (יָהוּיִד) H3061 (Not yehovad).

How do we know how it is said?

Second, what is the testimony of the last know ear witness:

A mitre also of fine linen encompassed his head, which was tied by a blue ribbon, about which there was another golden crown, in which was engraven the sacred name

[יהוה]: it consists of four vowels.

The Masorites did not appear until the 8th Century AD.

The vowel sounds are ay, ee, ah, oh, oo

The vowel sounds are ay, ee, ah, oh, oo

What can we know about how the YHVH is to be pronounced? First, let's see if there are any examples of just the YH in scripture which also reference it as the sacred name.

2 Yah is my strength and song, and he is become my yasha: he is my El, and I will prepare him a habitation; my father's Elohai, and I will exalt him.

When we look closely at יָה we see the pronunciation is actually ee-ah, or Yah. For those who think this is slang or an abbreviation, it appears in this form in the following verses:

We saw earlier that in both the case of the word for Judah and for Judea, the vav is pronounced as an "oo".

Maybe there are some people who would like to argues that Jews are really called "Joes" and that Judea was originally known as "Jodea" but I have never heard it.

How do we know how it is said?


Benjamin Netanyahu (an assumed name) knows how it is pronounced.

Here is one of the streets in modern day Jerusalem:

Yirmiyahu [יִרְמְיָהוּ] (Jeremiah) Street (the yod_heh_vav is pronounced ee-ah-oo)

Named after the biblical prophet, the route begins at Weizmann Boulevard at the base of the Strings Bridge, an area known historically as the western "Jerusalem Gate", the main entrance to the city from the west. It passes the beginning of Jaffa Road near the Jerusalem Central Bus Station and the headquarters of Magen David Adom. It then winds through the Romema neighborhood as a commercial and light-industrial four-lane divided boulevard.

There are 167 people in scripture with this name suffix, and many streets in Jerusalem reflect this suffix.



What names have we been given?



Have you ever noticed that the Jews use the spelling G_d, rather than God? Why is that?

Here is one worthy of closer scrutiny. Many have been told to replace the name Yahuah with the word ha'shem (supposedly meaning "the name"). This is the equivalent of saying "what's his name".

Asmodeus (/ˌæzməˈdiːəs/; Ancient Greek: Ἰσμοδαῖος, Asmodaios) or Ashmedai (/ˈæʃmɪˌdaɪ/; Hebrew: ʾ אַשְמְדּאָי, Ašmədʾāy; see below for other variations) is a prince of demons in Abrahamic religions.[1] In Judeo-Islamic lore he is the king of both daemons (jinn/shedim) and demons (divs). Asmodeus is mostly known from the deutero-canonical Book of Tobit, in which he is the primary antagonist. In Peter Binsfeld's classification of demons, Asmodeus represents lust. It is also mentioned in some Talmudic legends; for instance, the legend of the Temple of Solomon's construction.

Ashmedai (אַשְמְדּאָי) appears to have an ancient Persion or Zoroastrian root, stemming from the phrase aēšma-daēva meaning wrath-demon. The *Ashme* portion therefore of the Masoretic pronunciation of this term would signify *wrath*, and the *dai*, *demon*.

It is of interest that the ancient Persian pronunciation was **khashm-dev** When the rabbis developed the Talmud and the ineffable name doctrine and abandoned the Torah, they gave this name as the replacement.

What names have we been given?

Consider this excerpt from the KJV:

These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens,,

Bere'shiyth (Genesis) 2:4

When given its true meaning, the heavens and earth were created by the Ba'al of Luck in this translation.

Why was the true name taken away?

The "ineffable name" doctrine, a doctrine that teaches we should not pronounce our Heavenly Father's Name, appears as early as the 150 AD/CE in the works of Justin Martyr, a Samaritan convert to Christianity.

Justin made a special point about his many discussions with the Jews, discussions which apparently greatly influenced his own thinking in regard to the use of the name Yahweh:

"And all the Jews even now teach that the nameless God spoke to Moses." (I Apol., 63).

Why was the true name taken away?

The Ineffable Name name of "God"—his personal and most sacred name—occurs 6,828 times in the Hebrew scriptures. It is written with the Hebrew letters yod-heh-vav-heh – equivalent to the English letters YHVH. It looks like this. (Remember, Hebrew reads from right to left.)

For those who worship Ba'al, G_d, and Ashem'dai, what name will you declare in the midst of the assembly? When you say "Jesus", you might want to read of the name that he declared.

What is the call for the believer?

In the impassioned prayer of Mashiach in the garden the night before his death he said these things:

6 I have manifested your name unto the men which you gave me out of the world: yours they were, and you gave them me; and they have guarded your word.

Yochanon (John) 17:6

What name did he manifest to the men given to him? Baali? Adonai? Ha'shem? G_d? You who say Yahuah is Satanic – what name was it he manifested to them?

What is the call for the believer?

In the impassioned prayer of Mashiach in the garden the night before his death he said these things:

25 O Righteous Father, the world has not known you: but I have known you, and these have known that you have sent me. 26 And I have declared unto them your name and will declare it: that the love wherewith you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.

Yochanon (John) 17:6

Was Justin Martyr correct? Or did he succumb to the influence of those who believe that Mashiach is in hell boiling in a vat of semen? Whose word should we take – Mashiach's, or a rabbi?

What is the call for the believer?

For those who argue Paul as their lawgiver and Messiah, consider what he said:

12 For there is no difference between the Yahudiy and the Yavaniy: for the same Yahuah over all is rich unto all that call upon him.

13 For whosoever shall call upon the name of Yahuah shall be saved.

Romayim (Romans) 10:13

Pa'al is quoting scripture here, because unless he can substantiate his doctrine upon the existing Torah, he is nothing more than a clanging cymbal.

What is the call for the believer?

Pa'al in this instance was quoting Yo'el (Joel):

32 And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of Yahuah shall be delivered: for in Mount Tsiyon and in Yerushalayim shall be deliverance, as Yahuah has said, and in the remnant whom Yahuah shall call.

Yo'el (Joel) 2:32

וְהָיָה כֹל אֲשֶׁר־יִקְרָא בְּשֵׁם יהוה יִמְלֵט כִּי בְּהַר־צִיּוֹן וּבִירוּשְׁלַם תִּהְיֶה פְלִיטָה כַּאֲשֶׁר אָמֵר יהוה וּבַשְּׂרִידִים אֲשֶׁר יהוה קֹרֵא:

V'haya kol asher-yiqara b'shem Yahuah ymalet kee b'har-tsiyvoch u'b'Yerushalayim t'hayah phliytah ch'asher amer Yahuah u'bashariyriym asher Yahuah qara.

What is the call for the believer?

Where else does Pa'al quote the Old Testament? Here's one:

11 For it is written, As I live, **says Yahuah**, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to Elohiym.

12 So then everyone of us shall give account of himself to Elohiym.

Yo'el (Joel) 2:32

This is a direct quote from Yesha'yahu (Isaiah). Let the worshippers of Ba'al cut that out of their bibles!

What is the call for the believer?

10 Ye are my witnesses, says Yahuah, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he: before me there was no El formed, neither shall there be after me. 11 I, even I, am Yahuah; and beside me there is no savior. 12 I have declared, and have saved, and I have showed, when there was no strange elohiym among you: therefore, ye are my witnesses, says Yahuah, that I am El. 13 Yea, before the day was, I am he; and there is none that can deliver out.

Yesha'yahu (Isaiah) 42:10-13

What is the call for the believer?

The name is Yahuah is not for everyone. Those who call upon Ba'al, Adonai, Ha'shem, and G_d, are not those of the name, and may they take shelter in their pomposity.

9 Wherefore Elohiym also has highly exalted him and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Yahusha every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; 11 And that every tongue should confess that Yahuah is Yahusha Ha'Mashiach, to the glory of Elohiym the Father.

Philippiym (Philippians) 2:9-11

What is the call for the believer?

7 And to the angel of the called out assembly in Philadelphia write; These things says he that is holy, he that is true, he that has the key of David, he that opens, and no man shuts; and shuts, and no man opens; 8 I know your works: behold, I have set before you an open door, and no man can shut it: for you have a little strength, and have guarded my word, and have not denied my name. 9 Behold, I will make them of the synagogue of Satan, which say they are Yahudiym, and are not, but do lie; behold, I will make them to come and worship before your feet, and to know that I have loved you.

Chazon (Revelation) 3:7-9

What is the call for the believer?

10 Because you have guarded the word of my patience, I also will guard you from the hour of calamity, which shall come upon all the world, to try them that dwell upon the earth. 11 Behold, I come quickly: hold that fast which you have, that no man takes your crown. 12 Him that overcomes will I make a pillar in the Temple of my Elohiym, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my Elohiym, and the name of the city of my Elohiym, which is Renewed Yerushalayim, which comes down out of heaven from my Elohiym: and I will write upon him my new name. 13 He that has an ear, let him hear את what the Ruach says unto the called-out assemblies.
